No one could say that they had seen Him commit a sin. Everyone who knew Him, including Judas Iscariot, declared Him to be innocent of sin.

SECOND: ENLIST THE POWER OF HIS WORDS.

JEREMIAH 15:16 "Thy words were found and I did eat them; and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart; for I am called by thy name, O Lord God of hosts."

Repeatedly throughout the Gospels, you will find people, "astonished" at Jesus words. "No man ever spake like this man," can be found. While I was a student at Hyles-Anderson College, I loved the Chapel Services because of the preaching of God's Word, but I loved preaching about God's Word more than my other subjects. THIRD: EXPERIENCE THE PERMANENCE OF HIS SALVATION. JOHN 6:37 "All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." Continued

Be A Contender Jude 3



In verse 3, the Bible says, "that ye should earnestly contend for the faith ... " Earnestly means with some effort or working with diligence. In the context of this little book, Jude is speaking to you, to me, and to every Christian. He is speaking to those who have experienced the common salvation. He is not saying that salvation is just a common thing, but he is saying that everybody that has ever been saved has been saved the same way. of the list. I am afraid that many people do not understand what the Bible is saying when it says contend for the faith.

If the Bible tells us that we ought to do something earnestly, we should find out what God expects from us. As I began to study what the word contend means, it became a word that I love. I realized the word contend means "to strive, to judge, or to enter into judgment." People should strive and learn to judge regarding the faith. I am told by God to enter into judgment about the faith and to judge differently. We are to judge our faith differently than we would judge the color of a carpet, the color of a building, or anything else that really does not amount to anything with eternal value. I discovered that this is the same word that is used in Nehemiah Chapter 13. Nehemiah said, "I contended with them and cursed them." I have never cursed people publicly, but I have contended for issues of the faith. God wants us to earnestly contend for the faith. Contending is not only my responsibility but also the responsibility of everyone who is saved. Every preacher, layman, soul winner, and child of God is responsible to earnestly contend for the faith.

The Most Decorated Spy of WWII

Odette Sansom

"Be regular and orderly in your life," Flaubert had said, "that you may be violent and original in your work" Such is the prescription for spies. Odette Sansom didn't drink smoke, or swear, and to the casual observer she was quite ordinary, perhaps even boring. Yet she was a trained killer. She feared neither danger nor dagger, interrogation nor torture. She didn't think twice about confronting German generals or commandants, and often placed principle before prudence.

Like her colleagues in the Special Operations Executive, she signed up for the war knowing that arrest (and execution) was a very real possibility-almost one in two for F Section couriers. But what her grandfather had told her as a child was set in stone: she was to do her duty when the time came.

And so she did.

The year is 1942 when Odette Sansom makes the painful decision to leave her entire life behind and become an SOE agent to aid Britain and her beloved homeland, France. After grueling training and five failed landing attempts, she finally arrives in occupied France to begin her mission. It is here that she meets her commanding officer, Captain Peter Churchill.

As they complete mission after mission, their forged bond of trust gives way to love. All the while, they are hunted by Germany top spy-catcher, the relentless Hugo Bleicher. Bleicher finally succeeds in catching them and they are sent to Paris's Fresnes Prison, and then to concentration camps. In captivity, Peter and Odette are starved, beaten, and tortured, but never give up the whereabouts of their colleagues, their hope, or their love for each other.

By the way, because of the extreme training including hand-to-hand combat, weaponry, and parachute school, 80% of all male and females that tried to join SOE, were disqualified.

Be Not Dismayed Joshua 1:9

Recently, I have spoken to several pastors who are going through a difficult time in their ministries. However, these strays have changed and become critical for the strong positions these pastors have taken over the years. I think of *Joshua 1:9* as I think of what these men are facing. Four commands are given in this passage. The first three do not worry me about these men. However, the fourth one is the one I want to focus on the most.

Be Strong. There is no question in my mind that these pastors are strong men. They have proven their mettle and fought many battles.

Be of a Good Courage. I have seen these men courageously take a stand for what they believe. No doubt, they have good courage.

Be Not Afraid. These are not cowardly men. On the contrary, they know how to face the struggles and trials and put aside their fears to continue the fight.

However, the fourth command is not so easy.

<u>Be Not Dismayed.</u> It is hard sometimes not to be dismayed. We stay strong, fight the good fight, and overcome our fears; but then we become weary when we see others who do not want to fight anymore. It is here where my worries come.

I have fought not to be dismayed when former church members turn against me because they are tired of fighting and no longer remember the victories but only the struggles. Likewise, I have fought not to be dismayed when preacher friends quit fighting and change, becoming more pacifist in their positions.

To not be dismayed means to not be weary in well doing. When the battle is raging and we see no victory, we I must not be dismayed. When soldiers who once fought by our sides turn and retreat, it is hard not to be dismayed. I do not fight the first three commands as much as I do the fourth. The years of ministry have made me strong, given me the courage, and taken away my fears; but sometimes, it is hard not to feel dismayed.

Brethren, my challenge to you is to keep being strong, keep having good courage, and continue putting aside your fears. However, my greatest challenge to you is that when others flee and forsake you, be not dismayed, for God is with you, whithersoever thou goest.


should have ever won that war and won their independence except for the hand of God. God has had a plan for this nation; but every nation, if it forgets God, will

Worthy of Honor

Harriet Tubman, legendary leader of the abolitionist movement during the Civil War, has been posthumously commissioned a brigadier general in the Maryland National Guard. As Military.com reports, the honor is a "recognition for her service to the Union during the Civil War as an operational leader and spy."

Tubman, who has been called the "American Moses" for her courageous efforts in leading dozens of slaves to freedom via the Underground Railroad, made her own daring escape from slavery in 1849. When the war began, she volunteered to serve in the Union Army as a cook and field medic.

In June 1863, Tubman guided elements of the 3rd Rhode Island Heavy Artillery and the 2nd South Carolina Volunteer Infantry Regiment (a unit of Black soldiers) in gunboat operations along the Combahee River. "Thanks to the intelligence collected by Tubman, more than 750 men, women and children were liberated," the National Park Service recounts. "And U.S. troops destroyed several million dollars' worth of plantations, warehouses and rice fields along the river."

As Smithsonian points out, the Combahee operation "made Tubman the first American woman to oversee military action in a time of war."

Tubman's recognition and promotion to brigadier general came after the Maryland General Assembly passed legislation authorizing the governor "to posthumously promote, appoint or commission someone into the Maryland National Guard," Military.com reports.

During the ceremony, held near Tubman's birthplace in Maryland, Gov. Wes Moore described Tubman as "a soldier and a person who earned the title of veteran," calling her "one of the greatest authors of the American story." Moore added that Tubman "lived the values and virtues I was taught when I served in the United States Army... Live mission first, people always. Lead with honor, integrity, duty and courage. Leave no one behind. And with each act of courage, Harriet Tubman helped bring us together as a nation and a people.

She fought for a kind of unity that can only be earned through danger, risk and sacrifice.

And it is a unity we still benefit from to this day."

Maryland National Guard Adjutant General Maj. Gen. Janeen Birckhead said Tubman's "willingness to risk everything to help others to action - her moral conviction - inspired audacious actions."

E-Net And Cell Phones II Corinthians 2:11

In preparation for this article, the author sent out a survey to several thousand individuals. Only one survey came back indicating a disappointment in the survey itself. That person said the survey had "very clearly intended outcomes instead of seeking truth. Contrary to that opinion, we were seeking truth. We expected responders to answer the questions truthfully, regardless of any opinions we may have had. We made no effort to produce any intended outcome.

H. M. Tabb That man then went on to compare other potentially dangerous things we encounter in daily living which had nothing to do with the survey. His point was simply that we can find "boogers" under every rock if we look hard enough. He argued that tools are not the problem, but rather the character of those who use the tools. While we wholeheartedly agree with that, his arguments have no bearing on this study.

After hearing dozens of examples of problems arising in churches from internet gossip and internet porn, and of peoples lives being ruined and destroyed, a serious warning needs to be publicized. Many pastors have related their horror stories concerning their church members involving problems, many of which would never have developed before the birth of the internet and cell phones.

Many of the problems involving teenagers today are from parents allowing their teenagers use of the internet or smartphones when it is virtually impossible to police those things on a regular basis. The character of young people is in the process of developing, so it is easy to lead them astray when they are faced with wrong influences. We are dealing with a very serious problem that is destroying many of our young people (as well as many adults).

The man who took the survey mentioned above claims that if Christians deal with subjects such as this, it "hurts the cause of Christ and causes many people to have valid reasons not to trust us." However, we believe the cause of Christ is strengthened when God's people are warned about the wiles of the devil, including his latest tactics to move us away from our purpose for being here. Remember Paul's warning: "Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his devices" (2 Corinthians 2:11). That is an interesting word, Paul—"devices." Could that apply to iPads, iPhones, iPods, etc.?!

Suffice it to say, this article is in no way intended to be a blanket condemnation of modern electronic technology. We certainly realize that the internet, with all it involves, is a tool, and not everyone who uses it is using its dark side. But we believe everyone must admit that the internet has greatly increased the availability of evil. Statistics reveal 2,000+ new pornography sites from around the world are added to it daily. Surely, everyone realizes those sites are available even to children. (Yes, we are very aware of protective software and programs, but we are also aware of the fact that savvy computer kids can get past those programs.

Lest We Forget

An Air Force First

Capt. Lacie Hester is the first woman in the Air Force to receive the Silver Star, the nation's third-highest valor award.

As Air & Space Forces Magazine reports, the honor comes as a result of Hester's role, as an F-15E weapon systems officer, in intercepting waves of Iranian missiles and drones targeting Israel last year.

Maj. Benjamin Coffey, who piloted the F-15E, was also awarded the Silver Star. "At great personal risk, Coffey and Hester engaged low- altitude oneway attack UAVs in the complete darkness of night with the air-to-air Gatling gun of the F-15E, after they expended all their air-to-air missiles," according to the Air Force.
