Loyalty

INTRODUCTION: In II Samuel 15:20 we find an unusual verse, "...should I this day make thee go up and down with us?" David was fleeing Jerusalem as Absalom had plotted and gained support to take over the seat of authority at Jerusalem. Here we find a Philistine by the name of "Ittai" that had become totally loyal to King David. David did not expect, nor accept such loyalty from someone he had known only a short time. David tells him to go back, but he would not hear of it. Notice II Samuel 15:21.

"And Ittai answered the king, and said As the LORD liveth, and as my lord the king liveth, surely in what place my lord the king shall be, whether in

death or life, even there also will thy servant be." What loyalty, from a Philistine? Such loyalty that when David was restored to the throne this man was placed over the King's guards.

Loyalty has always been a characteristic of the Bible believing Christian.

FIRST: THE PROPER ORDER OF LOYALTY.

JOHN 17:17

1. Loyal To Truth.

"Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth." Truth must override all friendship!

2. Loval To Jesus.

Just as Ittai was loyal to King David, we must be loyal to Jesus the true King. By the way, if you're loyal to truth you will be loyal to Jesus.

3. Loyal To Your Church.

There are millions of names on church rolls in America, but very few of the members can be found. Their loyalty is found to be toward their front yard, or their job, or their hunting and fishing skills.

Example: Excavators found buried underneath an old English fort, on a carved sign, these words; "We will die rather than surrender." The church is our fort and we should be willing to die for Christ rather than surrender to the world.

4. Loyal To Our Convictions.

Our convictions should be based upon the teachings of the Bible, and we should be loyal to them. Moses was loyal as he stood against Pharaoh. Why did Moses not compromise with him? Because he was loyal to God above the power and might of a nation and its' leader.

5. Loyal To Our Mate.

Matthew 19:5 "...For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his offe..."

Illustration: The divorce rate is 50% in America. Why? Because of adultery and fornication! This is a result of disloyalty.

Does It Matter How a Christian Lives?





II Samuel 15:6 "...so Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel."

2. In Ahithophel, the Secretly Disloyal.

II Samuel 15:12

II Samuel 15:1-7

David's boyhood friend. He owed everything to David. He owed his job and his wealth to David yet was secretly trying to destroy him. "And Absalom sent for Ahithophel the Gilonite, David's counsellor..." Illustration: When I was a boy one of by best friends stole my wallet.

3. In Ittai, the Instinctively Loyal.

II Samuel 15:19

Illustration: When General Sherman was asked by a reporter as to why he was so loyal to General Grant, he replied, "When I was crazy he stood by me, and when he was drunk I stood by him, we've been friends ever since."

4. In Mephibosheth, a One-sided Loyalty.

II Samuel 16:1-3

David was loyal to Mephibosheth, but Mephibosheth merely used the loyalty David had for Jonathan to watch for a future opportunity to gain the throne.

5. In Shimei, we see Loyalty to Strength.

II Samuel 16:5 and 19:16

Cursing David when he leaves, but runs to him for mercy when he regains power.

6. In Hushai, we see Political Loyalty. II Samuel 16:18 Don't misunderstand. Hushai was totally loyal to David, but played the role of a politician to help David. II Samuel 17:6 and II Samuel 17:23.

7. In Barzillai, we see Loyalty Just Waiting.

II Samuel 19:32

This dear man was just waiting for an opportunity to reveal his loyalty and his love for his King.

THIRD: THE REWARDS QF LOYALTY.

MATTHEW 25:21

1. The Reward of Receiving Greater Understanding.

When you are a loyal friend, you will learn of the nature and reasoning behind your friend. But, if you're disloyal you will be shut out from learning from someone that may become your best friend.

2. The Reward of Greater Usefulness.

Once David was placed back into power he remembered those who stood by him in adversity. By the way, in Matthew 25:23 Jesus said to those loyal to him, "... thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things... "

3. The Reward of History.

You know what history continues to say about Judas Iscariot, and or Nero, but there is a wonderful truth behind history. The truth of history usually comes out.

Illustration: In New York City there is a bronze statue of a man with his hands and feet tied.

On that statue it states: "I regret that I have but one life to give for my country." These were the words of Nathan Hale, a great patriot.

CONCLUSION: When our soldiers returned from the battlefields of WWII, we cheered them because of their loyalty to our nation. One day, the greatest cheering will come from Heaven's balcony for those who were loyal to the cause of Christ.



Texas School District Removes Bible Due To Law Banning Sexually Explicit Content

The head of a Texas school district says the Bible had to be removed from school libraries because of a new state law prohibiting explicit books.

Canyon Independence School District Superintendent Darrell Flusche announced in an email that under House Bill 900, which was passed by the Texas legislature in 2023, protecting schools from sexually explicit or vulgar content, The Holy Bible is unsuitable due to "sexually explicit material." Flusche's statement cited the law's section defining "sexually explicit material" as "any communication, language, or material" that describes or depict sexual conduct in a matter that is "patently offensive" under the Texas Penal Code.

The email sparked outrage from local parents with many expressing disbelief at the decision. At a school board meeting on December 9, parent Regina Keene told school officials, "it seems absurd to me that the good book was thrown out with the bad books."

Realtor Accused of 'Hate Speech' For Posting Bible Verse

A Virginia realtor has been accused of hate speech for posting a Bible verse on Facebook in 2015. The realtor, who is also a pastor face the possibility of being hit with fines or could lose his license, which would jeopardize his longtime real estate career.

Two Staunton realtors, including an openly gay man, filed a complaint against Fauber with the Virginia Association of Realtors. The complaint accuses Fauber of 'hate speech.'

The alleged hate speech was a social media post that Fauber shared. Fauber reportedly reposted a Scripture from Reverend Franklin Graham that stated homosexual sex is a sin. [Leviticus 18:22] Paul Sacca, Blaze News
